About the conference:

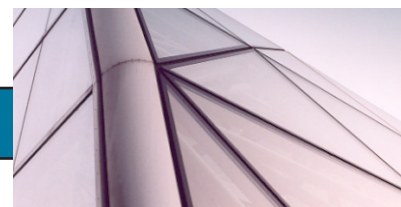
